M.1 Call to order, welcome

The meeting was called to order at 7:05 pm.

M.2 Attendance

Attendance sheets were circulated for signing.

M.3 Adoption of agenda

The agenda was adopted without change.

M.4 Review of May 28, 2015 minutes

The previous minutes were approved by email (July 9, 2015).

M.5 Annual report from Co-chairs

D. Cadeau summarized events of the past year. Full-day kindergarten (FDK) was implemented, an amended Runnymede School Council constitution was implemented, new artificial turf for the

front yard was approved and installed by TDSB prior to the start of school this month. New school social activities introduced last year included a Family Games Night, Movie Night, Costume Sale, and Strawberry Social. A lice check program was formalized which aimed to raise awareness, check students, and inform about treatment and prevention. A positive reduction in students with lice was seen this September. A new format at council meetings was also introduced last year to include Questions & Answers with A. Dennis (Principal) to encourage more interactive discussion. The launch of the Centennial Yard fundraising initiative was a huge success and the 2016 Centennial countdown initiatives are continuing this year.

M.6 Year-end Treasurer's Reports (2014-15)

The Treasurer presented the final financials from 2014-15 (see attached). At the end of the 2014-15 school year we had \$14K net income. The Council approved at the May 28, 2015 Council meeting to allocate any excess income towards the Centennial Playground fundraising initiatives (yard refresh).

M.7 Administration Update

A. Dennis summarized the following:

- The yard construction was a lot less stressful than last year's renovations for FDK. A lot of
 outdoor work was completed just before school started this year. The turf was installed by
 TDSB with funds from TDSB. Now that the yard is open for students, a safety concern was
 raised about handling approx. 800 children in the yard through lunchtime and certain
 activities had to be prohibited.
- Stairs on the Colbeck St. side of the school were replaced. Additional, minor side yard repairs are being wrapped up.
- Our overall enrollment has gone down by 20 students compared to last year, but French immersion enrollment is slightly higher. We received an extra teacher for the senior grades.
- Administration is looking for parent reps to participate on three committees: 1) safe and caring schools committee. The committee meets about three times per year. 2) budget committee (school budget distribution which can be found online and is based on enrollment); and 3) staffing committee, which meets around April and looks at projected enrollment and staffing models (i.e., class configurations). Please send A. Dennis a note if you are interested in participating on any of these committees.
- Parent volunteers per class are also needed to assist with communication dissemination which teachers are unable to perform due to the work-to-rule campaign.
- Several questions were raised around the kindergarten yard. Due to space and budget limitations, it may not meet all parents' expectations but the school is working within its limits. The budget available was issued by the province, not the school or TDSB, as part of the FDK roll-out.

M.8 Committee updates (~ 3 min/each)

M.8.1 Arts

Despite obstacles in 2014-15 with renovations in the Fall and subsequent lack of space for an Arts Enrichment Programme to operate in the previous years' locales, a new format was implemented. In the spring, Janeen Brownrigg of Lello Art School was able to provide 1h of arts enrichment for each JK-gr 2 class within their own classrooms (a huge undertaking!). As well, the Mayhem Brothers were welcomed back for a 1h dance class for all gr 3 students. In

a year of transition with many obstacles to overcome, we were thrilled to still deliver an Arts Enrichment Programme for all primary students. A very special thanks to the Administration and teachers for their efforts to keep this programme operating.

Our first Arts Committee meeting date will be posted on the Runnymede council website by Oct. 5. We invite all interested parents to attend!

M.8.2 Centennial / Centennial Playground

Last year the Centennial Committee worked with Parent Council to finalize and approve our Centennial Legacy Fundraising Project. We are working towards raising approximately \$225,000 to build the Centennial Playground in the front yard of the school (to accompany the new turf provided by the TDSB). To-date, we have raised more than \$175,000/\$225,000 towards this project and we intend to achieve our fundraising goal during this school year. We have several Fun Centennial/Fundraising events planned, culminating in the Centennial Open House and Fun Fair in May 2016. For the 2015-16 school year, many parent volunteers will be need to join the Centennial team and support this initiative.

M.8.3 Communications

The Communications Committee works behind the scenes with Council and school Administration to make your experience at Runnymede awesome. We run the classroom database, the Parent Council website, and send e-mail updates that keep you in the loop. Our goal this year is to do a website overhaul, to clean up and reorganize content on our site so it aligns better with Council's priorities and what parents/caregivers are looking for. We are also developing a plan for sending Council emails on a scheduled basis (ideally once per week or less) that keeps the information coming to you relevant, succinct, and timely. Volunteers needed - if you are interested in writing, editing, database administration, or web or graphic design, this is a fantastic opportunity to get involved with and support our school.No experience required! M.8.5 STEM

The **STEM** Learning committee refers to subjects including **S**cience, **T**echnology, **E**ngineering and **M**ath. The STEM Learning Committee is a group of parents interested in helping enrich Runnymede PS through hands-on science, math, and technology opportunities.

Activities in 2014-15:

- Held our third annual Amazing MATH Race in June 2015 for all students in grades 1-6.
 The Math Race is a grade-specific, half-day of fun math challenges that encourage students to use problem-solving and team-work skills
- In June 2015, held several MATH Angry Birds workshops for JK/SK classes
- We built additional **hands-on activity science kits** focusing on grades SK-6.
- We purchased manipulatives for math and science

The Yard Committee works to maintain the Hillside Garden nature area that is part of the school property, to encourage its use as an Outdoor Classroom and to work with the school to enhance the schoolyard for students' recess time.

- Ran Green Teacher Program for Grade 2, 4 and 6 classes during the Fall, Winter and Spring. + JK/SK program in Spring.
- Purchased and distributed new recess equipment (balls, hula hoops) in Fall and Spring.
- Purchased and prepared new outdoor play equipment specifically suited to the JK/SK Yard.
- Due to construction at the school last year, we were unable to hold our Spring and Fall Yard Day events, but we look forward to holding these events again this year, starting with Yard Day Saturday Sep. 26 from 9 am 12 pm

M.9 Ward 7 updates

Runnymede Public School is one of 22 schools in <u>Ward 7</u> of the Toronto District School Board (TDSB).

A publicly elected Trustee represents each Ward of the TDSB. Our Trustee, Robin Pilkey, holds Ward Council meetings throughout the year to share and discuss relevant topics and issues facing the TDSB. For example, a community consultation is planned for this year to consider student projections and feasibility of Runnymede PS becoming a JK-6 school. Gr. 7/8 students could potentially be directed to Annette PS or a section of Western Tech CI.

- Runnymede PS received a \$1K "Parents Reaching Out" (PRO) grant through TDSB to
 deliver a program on how to deal with student anxiety and stress. An evening seminar on
 this topic will be scheduled and open to other local schools.
- Police Checks are required for all volunteers in the school. For returning volunteers, a renewal list was available at the meeting. Parents/guardians could sign beside their name and be renewed for two years from the date indicated on the list. For new volunteers, see Anne Marie in the Office with any questions and for a copy of the police check forms. Police checks must be done through a process between the TDSB and Toronto Police Services. Police checks completed for other purposes (eg, nursery school, Scouts) cannot be accepted. There is a \$20 processing fee.
